Home staging is the process of cleaning, tidying and de-cluttering a property in preparation for professional photos. Homes that are clean, tidy and clutter-free achieve the best photos, attract more attention and achieve the best possible price.



PREPARING THE EXTERIOR

- Move vehicles from the driveway
- Remove any clutter (bins, tools etc)
- Remove dead plants & leaves
- Mow the lawn
- Clean doors, windows, driveway, patio & garden furniture
- Close doors & windows

PREPARING RECEPTION ROOMS & BEDROOMS

- Open curtains & blinds
- Make beds thoroughly
- Plump up cushions
- Remove clutter from under the bed
- Close all cupboards
- Turn the TV off
- Store TV remotes, magazines, kids toys etc out of sight

PREPARING THE KITCHEN

- Clear worktops & empty the sink
- Hide towels, cutlery, utensils& oven gloves
- Move bins, pet bowls & bedding out of sight
- Close all cupboards
- Remove all fridge magnets

PREPARING BATHROOMS

- Toilet lids to be left down
- Clear counter tops, removing bottles
- Pull back shower curtains
- Remove towels from rails or radiators
- Ensure toilet roll and brushes are presentable
